NYLT Registration Now Live

National Youth Leadership Training is the premier training course for Scouts BSA and Venturing youth. It provides the skills that youth leaders need to be successful in their Scouting roles and in life.

The NYLT course centers around the concepts of what a leader must *BE*, what they must KNOW, and what they must DO. The key elements are then taught with a clear focus on HOW TO. The skills come alive during the week as the patrol goes on a Quest for the Meaning of Leadership.

NYLT is a six-day course. Content is delivered in a troop and patrol team outdoor setting with an emphasis on immediate application of learning in a fun environment. Interconnecting concepts and work processes are introduced early, built upon, and aided by the use of mnemonics (memory aids), which allows participants to understand and employ the leadership skills much faster. Space is limited and course fills up fast so register now!

Widerness First Aid Training

The Jayhawk Area Council, BSA will be hosting a Wilderness First Training Course Friday, March 1st – Sunday, March 3rd at Falley Scout Reservation.. This training is open to youth, 14 years old and older, as well as any adult Scouter.

BSA High Adventure Base requires at least two adults with current Wilderness First Aid Training and CPR Training per contingent. Participants must have current CPR and First Aid Certification before attending these sessions. If CPR is not current you have the opportunity to do that for additional cost on Saturday evening. Orientation and survival techniques are not covered in this course on first aid.

There is a lot of information to be covered in this course. Due to the in-depth nature of the course, it will take place over three days. It is a 16 hour requirement. For additional info scan code below:
