At Falley Scout Reservation

Dear Parent/Guardian:

Congratulations on your Scout's commitment to attend the NYLT, the National Youth Leadership Training Course for 2024. Thank you for showing support for the Jayhawk Area Council's NYLT program and for the Boy Scouts of America.

During the week of the Course your Scout will have a chance to try out many new leadership skills that they can use in the program of their own Scout Unit and in the future. Developing leadership ability, acquiring new skills, and building lifelong friendships, are at the heart of the NYLT course.

With this letter to you, there is also a letter addressed to your Scout. You are encouraged to read through this letter as well to ensure that you have all the necessary information to assist your Scout in their preparations for the Course.

Arrival and Departure

The NYLT Course will be held at Falley Scout Reservation (FSR). **8602 Kingman Road Oskaloosa, KS 66066-5273**. Please plan to arrive between **11:00 AM and 11:30 AM on Sunday, May 26**th, **2024**. **Please make sure that your Scout(s) has already eaten lunch prior to arriving at camp** as it will be a few hours before we have food available.

ATTENTION FOR 2024: There is construction on US-24 in both directions near Perry. The construction may affect how your family would like to travel to FSR, so please plan your route accordingly.

You and your Unit Leader are invited to return to camp for the Closing Ceremony: *Creating a Better Future* on Friday. **Please arrive no sooner than 7:00 PM on Friday**. At roughly 7:15 members of the Adult NYLT staff will give a presentation about what the Scouts accomplished during the week. The Closing Ceremony will take place after a short walk to Inspiration Point where everyone will watch the skits that the Scouts have prepared during the week. **The course will be dismissed after the ceremony, between 8:45 and 9:00 PM**.

Cell Phone Policy and Course Code of Conduct

With this letter is a copy of the NYLT Cell Phone Policy and the Course Code of Conduct. The Cell Phone policy is reviewed by both the Adult and Youth Staff and was written to help ensure that Scouts get the most from the course. While the course would be best if no Scout brought a cell phone, the Staff recognizes that certain situations require the use of technology. These situations could include medical, emergency, or developing/unique family situations. If after reviewing the policy you still feel the need that your Scout has their phone with them, please check the appropriate box and give a brief description on the Cell Phone Policy.

Please review and sign both documents in their entirety and bring a signed copy of the document with you to check in.

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Preparing for NYLT

Packing and Equipment

A packing list of equipment is included with the letter address to your Scout. This list is reviewed every year to ensure that it has the necessary equipment for the course. If your Scout has not already done so, they are encouraged to write their name and unit number on important personal equipment.

Waterproof gear as much as possible

To make your Scout's campout more enjoyable in the Kansas rain, they are encouraged to pack as much as possible in plastic Ziplock bags or other waterproof bags. A large trash bag can be used to help waterproof a backpack if you don't have a pack-cover. Waterproofing spray can be found in the camping section (and often the shoe section) at Walmart to help keep shoes and rain-jackets from soaking through.

Tents

For the majority of the course, NYLT participants will be staying in canvas wall tents provided by Falley Scout Reservation. Scouts will be provided a foam mattress and cot to use in these tents.

Thursday night, the patrols of NYLT will go on an backpacking outpost adventure to a different part of Falley Scout Reservation. Because of this, Scouts will need to bring backpackable sleeping bag, air/foam mattress, and a tent. One or two person backing tents are acceptable. If your family does not have a backpacking tent, check with your Unit as you might be able to borrow one for the week. NYLT prefers that Scouts bring two-person tents so that they can buddy up with Scouts who were unable to bring a tent.
