Youth that has turned 18, will need SYT and Adult Application with Background Check Authorization.

### SAFETY MOMENT

## Staying warm during cold-weather camping is crucial, and the "C-O-L-D" method helps:

- C = Clean: Keep insulating layers clean to maintain warmth.
- O = Overheating: Avoid overheating by adjusting layers and staying hydrated; limit energy drinks.
- L = Loose layers: Wear multiple loose layers to ensure proper circulation and insulation; opt for bright colors for visibility.
- D = Dry: Keep clothes dry to prevent rapid cooling; brush off snow and keep neck areas loose for heat escape.

### Proper nutrition is also vital:

- Consume sugars (fire starters), carbohydrates, proteins (kindling), and fats (energy).
- Stay hydrated with water or sports drinks; avoid energy drinks.

### **CALLING ALL KLONDIKE MUSHERS!**

I am very excited to invite you to the Klondike Derby, This year we will be utilizing the beautiful Pomona State Park. The Klondike Derby is an annual event held by some Scouting America councils and Scouts Canada councils during the winter months. This established on the heritage of the klondike gold rush.

The Klondike gold rush was a migration by an estimated 100,000 prospectors to the Klondike region of the Yukon in northwestern Canada, between 1896 and 1899. Local miners discovered gold there on August 16, 1896. When news reached Seattle and San Francisco the following year, it triggered a stampede of prospectors. Scouting America units have been running klondike derbies since 1949.

The Klondike Derby consists of several stations where patrols/units must test their scoutcraft skills and their leadership abilities, earning points towards a total score. Often, one or more races are included while the Scouts navigate between stations. The unit must transport their gear on a homemade sled pulled by the Scouts.

So get your sleds packed and your winter gear on. Hook forward to seeing you all there.

# SPREAD OUT YOUR MEMBERSHIP FEES WITH KLARNA!

The Jayhawk Area Council has joined an expanded pilot program with Scouting America that will allow you to pay your annual registration fees over multiple payments rather than all at once.

Now, you can choose to pay for your membership in Scouting America with a Credit Card or select Klarna and pay in 4 equal installments over six weeks at no extra charge. This is for new or renewal families.

Once you complete the application, go to the payment screen, review the fees and verify the Scout Life Magazine setting is correct. The Klarna option will be there for you to select and complete the steps to set up your payments. Once you click on "Pay with Klarna," you will return to the Scouting America Receipt, which will show you have paid in full. You are all paid up with Scouting but will still owe Klarna for the remaining 3 payments. Klarna will pull the funds from your account based on the payment schedule you set.

So far, from the initial pilot councils, they have seen about 33% of all registrations being set up on a payment schedule. We look forward to offering this option to our families.
