## READY FOR NYLT?

National Youth Leadership Training is the premier training course for Scouts BSA and Venturing youth. It provides the skills that youth leaders need to be successful in Scouting roles and in life.

The NYLT course centers around the concepts of what a leader must *BE*, what they must *KNOW*, and what they must *DO*. The key elements are then taught with a clear focus on *HOW TO*. The skills come alive during the week as the patrol goes on a quest for the meaning of leadership.

The deadline to apply for a \$200 NYLT scholarship is coming up fast on February 23! Two scholarship recipients will be selected and recognized at the Wood Badge & NYLT Banquet, so be sure your Scout applies in time.

This year's youth staff is hard at work preparing an incredible six-day NYLT experience that will take place May 24 - 29, 2026 at Falley Scout Reservation. Parents of past participants consistently share how much NYLT has strengthened their Scout's confidence, leadership skills, and enthusiasm for Scouting.

The first 28 Scouts to register will receive a \$50 discount, so early registration is strongly encouraged. ## ATTENTION ALL DIRECT CONTACT LEADERS

As we move over into the winter months and start seeing inclement weather, this is a great time to update your Hazardous Weather Training. This is required training for ALL Direct Contact Leaders and must be renewed every two years.

Training can be done when you are available because it is exclusively online. Simply log into [my.scouting.org](http://my.scouting.org) and visit the training section to take the course.

Many Scouting programs take place in the outdoors. This training discusses how to manage risks from the weather to our Scouting families. Let's be proactive and get 100% trained by January 20.

## NRA BASIC RANGE SAFETY OFFICER COURSE

Scouting America Jayhawk Area Council seeks to develop new certified range safety officers who possess the knowledge, skills and attitudes essential to organizing, conducting, supervising and safely operating target and range activities. This course is designed to prepare experienced shooters to perform the basic duties of a Range Safety Officer (RSO). RSO's ensure that the users of a range follow range regulations in order to reduce property damage and personal injury. 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## ANNUAL ORDER OF THE ARROW DUES NOTICE

If you or your Scout has been inducted into the Order of the Arrow (OA), it is now time to renew your annual membership. Your annual dues support the efforts of your local Dzie-Hauk Tonga Lodge as well as the National Order of the Arrow. The lodge's portion supplements the overall cost of the fellowships and winter banquet to ensure all can participate. The lodge provides support for camp development at Falley Scout Reservation and the summer camp program by providing an OA Coordinator on the camp staff. The number of paid members in the Dzie-Hauk Tonga Lodge determines how many Vigil Honor and Founders Award recipients we can select annually so it is important that we have all our inducted members current in their dues.

You have two payment options for your dues. You can pay the annual fee of just \$20.00 or you can choose the Arrow Pass option. For \$100.00, you not only cover your dues, but you also become automatically registered for the winter banquet and both fellowships (general member) – a savings of 15% over paying for each individually.

## SCOUTING AMERICA OFFERS FAMILY TROOP OPTION

The family troop model became available as a third option to all chartering organizations on December 15, 2025. This is in addition to a boy-only or girl-only troop. This option was piloted in select councils and received positive reactions overall by those involved.

This is not a mandate for troops to convert to a family option nor is it expected for linked troops (gender specific troops with same chartering organization) to merge. Each troop along with their chartering organization needs to make the decision that is in the best interests of the youth, families, and community they serve.

The Jayhawk Area Council commissioner staff is being briefed on how to assist your troop with this conversation. There is a Family Troop Decision Guide and a Family Troop Best Practices Guide to assist you with your discussions. It is extremely important to have an engaged discussion as recommended in these materials. This is not and should not be a light decision. If your troop decides to convert to a family troop, the Intent to Convert form MUST be completed and submitted to the Jayhawk Area Council office. Cheryl Collins, our registrar, has specific instructions as to what she needs to do in My.Scouting to complete the conversion. Without the Intent to Convert form, she cannot make any changes.

## SCOUTING AMERICA INTRODUCES NEW UNIFIED SCOUTS BSA HANDBOOK

Based on significant feedback from youth and volunteers, Scouting America is pleased to announce the release of a unified Scouts BSA Handbook designed for all youth who are part of the Scouts BSA program.

This handbook does not replace the current 14th Edition of the Scouts BSA Handbook, and this unified version has no major program changes. It is simply a single, unified version of the handbook that can be used by boys or girls in Scouts BSA. The text remains the same, but photos now reflect all youth in Scouts BSA. Leaders, youth, and units spoke about their desire for this unified version, and they listened.

Since there are no changes to the requirements, the Jayhawk Scout Shop will continue to sell the gender-specific handbooks while supplies last. We anticipate the new handbooks to reach our store late January/ early February depending on the supply of current handbooks the national supply center has in stock. They will send out the new ones once they exhaust the current inventory.

## THANK YOU FOR AN AMAZING YEAR!

With 2026 upon us, it is a great time to look back at some of the accomplishments your Jayhawk Area Council has had over the past year.

Over 350 new Scouts and families came out to Falley Scout Reservation to have their first Cub Scout experience at our annual Cub Adventure Day. This was provided at no charge for the Scout and the family members paid a small fee to cover lunch. All new Scouts that registered before October 31, received at no charge their new Scout handbook helping set the path to advancements. We continue to expand the number of packs, troops, crews and posts finishing the year with an increase of almost 5%!

To date, we have just shy of 40 Eagle Scouts with more finishing up their boards of review before the end of year. We had one Venturing Scout who completed the very challenging Summit Award. The 2025 Class of Eagle Scouts will be recognized at our council banquet in February. Overall, we have seen close to a 6% increase in Scouts earning advancements.

Our annual National Youth Leader Training (NYLT) and our biennial Wood Badge course trained 30 youth and adult leaders respectively in effective leadership skills. Our courses continue to be of the highest level of quality both in participants and staff. The Wood Badge/NYLT banquet through its auction supplements the registration costs for these courses making it affordable for anyone to attend.

Falley Scout Reservation has seen increases in overall attendance with close to 2,500 weekend visitors this year in addition to our summer camp season. Camp was used almost every weekend of 2025 by someone. The campmaster corps and the camp maintenance was busy serving our guests and keeping our camp in the great shape our visitors come to expect. Our Range and Target Activities committee continues to expand opportunities for our Scouts to take part in fun and educational activities. We are revitalizing our ropes course (COPE) and climbing tower with a new committee, new emphasis and upgraded facilities.

We have a lot to be thankful for. So much more than can be included in one article. Thanks to the over 600 volunteers that help provide the Scouting program to our close to 1,200 youth every day. Thanks to the almost 70 chartering organizations that provide local meeting locations for our Scouts. Thanks to the many supporters, both individuals and companies, of our special events and annual giving campaign (Friends of Scouting) that choose to invest in the success of this great Scouting program.

On behalf of the Jayhawk Area Council staff, we wish you a great holiday season and look forward to an outstanding 2026.
