WILDERNESS FIRST AID

Jayhawk Area Council will be hosting a Wilderness First Aid training course Friday, April 24 - Sunday, April 26 at Falley Scout Reservation. This training is open to youth, 14 years old and older, as well as any adult volunteer.

Scouting America requires that any contingent attending a BSA High Adventure Base have at least two adults with current Wilderness First Aid Training and CPR Training. Wilderness First Aid Training is good for two years. Due to the in-depth nature of the course, it will take place over three days.

RECHARTER TIME


The time is here to get your unit rechartered. As you are preparing to get those done, you may run into some obstacles and need some help. Well don't hesitate to reach out to:

SAFETY MOMENT: STAYING SAFE ONLINE FOR SCOUTS



In today's digital world, Scouts use the internet for learning, communication, and fun—but online activities come with responsibilities. A strong safety mindset helps Scouts live the values of Scouting both on and offline.

Protect personal information: Scouts should never share full names, home addresses, school details, passwords, or locations online. What seems harmless can quickly become unsafe if it reaches the wrong audience. Using strong, unique passwords and keeping them private is an important first step in online safety.

Practice respectful communication: The Scout Law applies online just as it does in person. Be kind, courteous, and respectful in messages, comments, and posts. Cyberbullying, teasing, or sharing hurtful content is never acceptable—and Scouts should speak up to a trusted adult if they see it happening.

Think before you click or post: Not everything online is true or safe. Scouts should avoid clicking unknown links, downloading suspicious files, or responding to messages from people they don't know. Once something is posted online, it can be difficult—or impossible—to take it back.

Follow Scouting guidelines and involve adults: Online Scouting activities should follow the safety standards of Scouting America, including appropriate supervision and approved platforms. If something feels uncomfortable or confusing online, Scouts should pause and ask a parent, guardian, or Scout leader for help.

By staying alert, respectful, and cautious, Scouts can enjoy online activities while protecting themselves and others—building good digital citizenship that lasts a lifetime.
